- Read-a-Thon: Jenny presented information that the Read-a-Thon (RaT) will kick off with an assembly featuring Alex Zerbe on Feb. 28. Prizes will include certificates to the book fair, rubber chicken and barrel of money key chains.
  - Update: One of the bigger prizes was overlooked: in past years, readers have won movie tickets. Jenny and Janina decided to continue that tradition, but change it to movie tickets to the Crest Theatre here in Shoreline. They will be \$15 certificates which will allow for 5 admissions.

The matter of any leftover funds in club accounts is not something that happens often, but in the event that it does, it is the hope of the task force that these funds may be able to be moved into a scholarship fund – this and other information will be fine tuned an presented at a future meeting for board approval.
