

Friendship, Families and Feelings

Last month, I wrote about the importance of sleep for children. Many children go through their days sleep-deprived, which can have a dramatic negative impact on academic performance, emotional stability and healthy weight.

Children from 3–12 years old need a minimum of 10 hours of sleep. Often, parents think their children get more sleep than they actually do.

If you are concerned about the amount of sleep your child gets, here are some ideas, taken from the Web sites webmd.com and sleepforkids.org, that might help:

- Teach school-aged children about healthy sleep habits.
- Emphasize the need for regular and consistent sleep schedule and bedtime routine.
- Make your child's bedroom conducive to sleep—dark, cool and quiet. Keep the bedtime environment (e.g. light, temperature) the same all night long.
- Keep TV and computers out of the bedroom. According to one recent study, TV viewing prior to bed can lead to difficulty falling and staying asleep. Save your child's favorite relaxing,

- non-stimulating activities until last and have them occur in the child's bedroom.
- Avoid caffeine.
- Make bedtime the same time every night.

Encourage Children To Fall Asleep On Their Own Have your child form positive associations with sleeping. A child should not need a parent to help him/her fall asleep. The child who falls asleep on his or her own will be better able to return to sleep during normal nighttime awakenings and sleep throughout the night. Except during conditions when the child is sick, has been injured or clearly requires your assistance, it is important to give your child a consistent message that they are expected to fall asleep on their own.

Talk to your child's doctor about sleep. Parents/caregivers should discuss their child's sleep habits and problems with their child's doctor, as most sleep problems are easily treated. Healthcare professionals must regularly ask about a child's sleep.


Yearbook Club

Focus Day is February 20, 2012


Each year PTA members from across the state travel to the State Capitol to meet and lobby their legislators on behalf of our kids and their education and join in a rally on the Capitol Steps.

Photography Enrichment

Description: This grant will cover disposable film cameras and developing costs for a third grade class. With the direction of creating a personal portfolio, documenting individual communities and relationships, students will see our world through multiple lenses. Along with the photographs, students will incorporate a writing portion with this study, practicing their ability to connect images to words. The end product will yield an in-depth perception of a child and his or her own ideas on how we, as a community, impact our environment, and on how they, as a generation, visualize the natural wonders of the world.

Special Ed Conference-SLP

Description: This grant will pay a portion of the cost for Ms. Cox to attend the 2012 Special Education Conference in March, sponsored by Western Washington University. The purpose of this conference is to provide up-to-date research and treatment strategies on a wide variety of special education issues. This conference provides numerous opportunities for professionals to acquire new information and ideas to work collaboratively to meet the needs of students with special needs. As a speech language pathologist working with students with developmental delays, learning more about up-to-date technology for students to access communication is beneficial. This teacher is currently using a district-issued iPad with students and would like more support to make the best use of it.

Children's Literature Seminar

Description: MP Librarian Ms. Hillger will attend "What's New in Children's Literature and How to Use it in Your Program 2012," a seminar on the latest and best children's literature, presented by Peggy Sharp, an internationally recognized authority on children's literature with decades of experience. By attending the seminar, Ms. Hillger will learn about the best new books for all elementary students and new ways to incorporate technology, such as social networking sites where students can share their favorite books with one another and the use of e-readers such as the iPad.
