Principal's Letter


Dear Families—

Families, Friendships, Feelings, Fun

Think about all you do to keep your children safe and healthy: make sure they wear seatbelts and bike helmets, exhort them to brush and floss, encourage them to eat nutritious foods, and much more.

In addition, before your child goes to a friend's house for a play date, you might ask some questions about that household, such as what kind of videos they watch, do they have pets, or does their trampoline have a net around it.

One more step you can take to increase your child's safety is to talk with other parents about whether they have guns in their house, and if so, how they are stored.

One Meridian Park parent who practices this safety measure had a positive experience with another Meridian Park parent when her child was in first grade.

After asking if there were any guns in the home of her child's new friend, she (I'll call her parent A) learned that a gun was kept in a box in the closet of the other parent's (who I'll call Parent B).

Parent B explained he wasn't concerned because his child wasn't one to go snooping around and find it.

"But my child is!" replied Parent A.

They talked about it, and Parent B agreed to buy a gun safe, which is where the gun is now stored.

The conversation was warm and considerate from start to finish, with both sets of parents assuming positive intent from each other.*

NOTES FROM P.E.

THE POWER OF WALKING

In last month's *Cheetah Chatter*, I spent some time outlining the danger of sedentary habits in what health professionals have come to refer to as the disease of sitting. In short, research is increasingly revealing that the simple act of sitting too much has many of the same ill health effects associated with smoking cigarettes.

While the obvious remedy to the this problem is sitting less, often people are left a little perplexed about what is the best way to get daily recommendations of exercise. Should I start jogging? Join a Gym? Hire a personal trainer? As a health and fitness profession with over twenty years of experience in the field, I have witnessed a lot of trends come and go with plenty of bad information to boot. The multi-billion dollar health and fitness industry is happy to keep reinventing the wheel when is comes to the latest and greatest exercise program. They are even happier to package it up and sell it to you! The solution however, is really quite simple; we should all walk more.

A couple years ago Dr. Mike Evans put together a visual presentation titled 23 ½ hours and published it on You Tube. If you haven't watched the short film, it is less than ten minutes long and provides a wealth of research based information making a strong case for low output cardiovascular exercise (walking) as the single most effective prescription for improving health and longevity.

Specifically, Dr. Evans provides the following points. 30-60 minutes of moderate intensity exercise each day:

- Reduces pain and dysfunction in arthritic patients by 47%.
- Reduces progression and dementia and Alzheimer's in elderly by 50%.
- Reduces progression of diabetes in pre-diabetics by 58%.
- Reduces risk of fractures in certain populations by 48%.
- Reduces anxiety by 48%.
- Reduces depression by up to 47%.
- Reduces overall risk of premature death by 23%.

If a pharmaceutical company could bottle up a pill that accomplished these things, they would make millions of dollars! Fortunately for all of us, walking is easy, accessible and best of all free. As the days begin to get a little longer and the weather not quite so dreary, I highly recommend that you find ways to build a little bit more walking into your life. Is it possible to walk to school a couple days a week? Is the grocery store a reasonable distance to walk? Could a recreational outing, like going to Seattle be accomplished by bus and walking? Walking with your kids reinforces a family commitment to health and fitness, interact with the outdoors and is an excellent opportunity to connect with your children and talk to them. Definitely a

Because we cannot include non-club-members in our Math Club team practices, due to PTSA program rules. Unlike previous years, 3rd-graders and below are no longer allowed at Shoreline Math Olympiad, per the contest organizers. Please do not bring 3rd-graders and below to the contest. This rule applies to Math Club members too. If you're not in 4th grade yet, we hope to see you in a future year!


