Dear Families:

We are at mid-point for this year and second trimester, and we appreciate our partnership to help your student and each of our students, be safe, happy, and learning.

Thank you for attending recent conferences. As for ongoing classroom communication, you should be hearing from your teacher about classroom learning and curriculum at least once monthly through a class newsletter, website update, or both. While scheduled conferences for this year are complete, we are always available to visit by email, phone, or in person. Progress reports will be sent home March 31.

Communication is also important when there's a problem or concern. Our general guideline is to communicate concerns with staff closest to the situation and resolve at the lowest level possible. It's helpful to communicate quickly/privately, assume the best, and take a positive approach. While I am always happy to help, it's usually faster and easier to work things out directly with your teacher or staff directly involved. Thanks.



experiences Art and education are a valuable part of a child's total education, and we thankful to our staff, PTA art docents, and other art docents who provide valuable art experiences. It's a challenge to find

time in the school day for everything we value in providing a well-rounded education, but we're

committed to a good balance of academics, the arts, fitness, and other areas. Thanks for our partnership with the arts and academics.

Lunch and recess are important parts of the school day and our students' total school experience. My staff and I talk regularly to refine our supervision procedures and reflect on ways to improve these experiences. We want lunch and recess to be safe, positive, and fun for our kids.

The purpose is to "raise levels of empathy, resulting in more respectful and caring relationships and reduced levels of bullying and aggression." Congratulations to our Global Reading Challenge Teams! We encourage families to read together daily. Lunch Bunch has made its debut at Meridian Park!

Many MP students enjoy having lunch in the Family Advocate office. There are many reasons for this. It is quiet and calm with a small group of children. Some kids like getting a bit of extra adult attention, and they just like the novelty of it. Because it is so popular, and is a good way for me to get to know the student body better, I have instituted Lunch Bunch.

Here's how it works: Every Friday, teachers can give two students from their classroom a Lunch Bunch pass. They can choose the same students repeatedly, use it to reinforce positive behavior, or choose randomly. It is up to the teacher.

I meet the students at the double doors of the cafeteria and we walk to my office and have lunch together. We might pick a topic to talk about, I might read to them while they eat, we might just talk. It is flexible, fun, and friendly, and I hope it will be a positive addition to the dynamic world of Meridian Park.
