TONI ENGLISH AWARD


The votes are in and our 2013-2014 Toni English winners are...

Principal's Letter

Dear Families,

Thank you for a fantastic year. Because of our amazing staff, students, parent partnership, Meridian Park Cheetahs are learning and growing.

You're invited to our Back to School BBQ in the fall sponsored by PTA. Please mark your calendar for Thursday, August 28 and join your neighbors for a community BBQ. This will be a great event to build community and kick off the year. K-2 families are invited to meet their teacher and see their classroom at 5:00 pm, followed by dinner.

Our teacher teams are working carefully to create tentative class lists for next year. With two kids of my own, I know the anxieties involving class assignment. At MP, we are intentional about creating classes that are balanced, provide the best opportunity for student success, and are a good match for teacher, student, and family. Teachers collaborate in teams and consider many important factors, including social dynamics, learning and teaching styles, and class size.

There's also the possibility of class assignment changes after school starts. Because of enrollment changes over the summer and the first week of school, we may need to move students after school starts. The District standard is that teacher and student assignments are tentative and reassignments might be required after school has begun and actual enrollment can be verified. These changes, however, will be done as early as possible, to provide as minimal disruption as possible. We'll try to avoid changing classes around after the first day of school.

Additional classroom support will be provided, when necessary, for supporting large classes. I will work closely with staff to provide the support they need if classes exceed contractual limits. There's always the possibility of combination classes, which are great opportunities for a multiage learning environment.

There are many people to thank for making this year special:

• Classroom teachers for the core academic and social experience each day

- Specialist teachers for enriching our lives with art, music, PE, library, and other areas
- Support staff for all you do to support the classroom experience
- Everyone who makes art special in our school
- PTSA for being our partners in your kids' education
- Parent volunteers for all your time and talents

Thanks and best wishes to retiring staff Marty Behnke and Dennis Simpson. Thank you! We have the best group of classified support staff, including Diane, Jill, Annie, Susan, Tama, Lue/Jim/Gary, and our awesome supervisors, crossing guards, and para-educators.

There are so many highlights from this year! I appreciate that even as a great school, we continue to grow and improve. Our staff cares about providing the best and most balanced experience possible for all students.

Our kids had wonderful experiences in music, PE, library, and with art. Recess was full of exercise, fresh air, and a bit of rain. 


