Your students are engaged in learning activities for third trimester, and our staff members are working hard to provide meaningful teaching and learning activities each day until summer break. Students in grades 3 – 6 are involved in state assessments. It's an important activity to check on progress. On time attendance is really helpful, and we appreciate you supporting your student with encouragement, a good breakfast, and consistent routines. Go Cheetahs!

There is some chatter in the local communities and media about the national standards and testing, and I encourage you to read, learn, and decide for yourself. Completing my 30th year, I suggest that essential learning standards are a step in the right direction for a public school system that should successfully prepare all students for a complex world; and for school or work after high school. 

END-OF-THE-YEAR LIBRARY BOOK ROUND UP

The school year is winding down quickly. In order to complete an inventory of all library books, we will need them turned in before the last week of school. Below is a schedule to help students return their books.

By Tuesday, May 26th, a student can have no more than two library books checked out.

By Monday, June 1st, a student can have no more than one library book checked out.

By Tuesday, June 9th, students must have all library books returned to the library.

Students who still have books on their library records after June 9th will take home letters to share with parents, letting them know about the overdue books. If a book cannot be found, a student can either purchase a replacement copy with the same binding and cover, or pay for the book.

Students will not receive their report cards on the last day of school, June 19th, if they haven't taken care of their overdue and lost books. Report cards will be held in the front office until students find, replace, or pay for books.

Please help your children look for library books at home, as well as in vehicles.

SPRING GRANT WINNERS ANNOUNCED

The Meridian Park PTSA is pleased to announce the recipients of the spring grants. During the 2014-2015 school year, the PTSA awarded more than \$3,500 in grant funds in two cycles (fall and spring). The grant program provides members of the Meridian Park Elementary community with an opportunity to receive one-time funding to support enrichment and academic program enhancements. The grant program supports innovative approaches and creative ideas by funding supplies, equipment, and projects that provide unique learning experiences that are not currently supported by other funding sources. The funds used for these grants have been raised through generous donations from the families and friends of Meridian Park Elementary.

Sandi James, Mary Loes, Diana Kushner, Christina Leggett, and Jenny Hillger have been awarded \$576.00 for A Kid's World: Extending 1st grade science & social studies unit. With this grant, first grade students will be provided with more resources to supplement the GLAD unit on Families to include additional activities. The grant funds the purchase of reference books, physical maps, globes, and tri-fold presentation boards. With this grant, Grade One will extend the Families Unit with additional ageappropriate integrated social studies, language arts and arts/crafts activities for the 3rd trimester.

The goal of the project is that each student will complete a "World Traveler" Portfolio. The portfolio will include outcomes in map skills, world geography and cultural studies for each continent, informational reports on a group continent (a family, an animal, a cultural event), group presentations as well as art projects.

Sixth-grade teachers Nicole Mauge and Lisa Sezate received \$186.00 for a Chicken Mummification project. Students in the 6th grade general education classes will work in small groups to mummify chickens. The objectives of the project are to gain a detailed knowledge of the mummification process through non-fiction reading and simulation and to gain an awareness and knowledge of the cultural beliefs on which mummification was based and an appreciation of an ancient culture's dedication to those beliefs.

Librarian Jenny Hillger will use her grant of \$490.00 to replace the MP3 players that teachers and students use to listen to audiobooks. The current collection of six iPod Nanos was purchased 10 years ago with a PTSA grant. Over the past decade, teachers have used the iPods to differentiate the ways in which students can access texts in the classrooms. They have used them successfully for small group and individual reading assignments. The iPods have served the school well, but they are now older and no longer reliably work.

The project will increase the library MP3 player collection by adding six new devices. Teachers will be able to access the new MP3 players, and the older ones will be repurposed for student check out. This plan will maintain the current program, as well as allow students independence in using library equipment to download audiobooks that can be accessed through the public library system and a subscription service available through the district.

The Shoreline Head Start program is a free part-day preschool program for income-eligible families. Our program at Meridian Park serves those living within the Shoreline School District. We offer a quality learning environment, supportive staff and family engagement, nutritious meals, and have interpreter services.

This program is available for children 3-5 years (3 years by August 31st), children in Foster Care/Kinship Care, TANF and SSI recipients, families experiencing homelessness, children with a disability or IEP, and families on limited income.
