

Families, Friendship, Feelings & Fun

MP students and staff recently watched Taproot Theater's annual skit about bullying. It was fun and well done, and once again reminded children of the three steps they can take to prevent bullying:

- Recognize- Bullying is one sided. It threatens or excludes people. It causes the recipient to feel scared or sad.
- Refuse: Tell the person doing the bullying know that you want them to stop, or walk away.
- Report: If you've "refused," and the bullying continues, report it to a trusted adult.

The skit also addressed how bystanders can be powerful allies to a child being bullied.

Often, when children hurt someone's feelings, it is not a matter of bullying. Children (and adults!) have lapses of empathy. Sometimes they are socially clumsy. Sometimes they are being intentionally mean, but not in the one-sided, threatening manner that would elevate the behavior to bullying. Even these common insensitivities, however, can chip away at their peers' feelings of emotional safety at school. Children often do or say hurtful things because they don't know an

alternative. It's our job as adults to help them learn alternatives.

One way to do that is to play "what-if" games with them, in which they imagine empathic ways to handle challenging situations. For instance:

- What if someone was telling a story that wasn't interesting to you?
- What if someone gave the wrong answer to a question that seemed easy to you?
- What if you were invited to a birthday party by a classmate, but another of your friends wasn't?
- What if you want to play with someone different than who you usually play with?

I'm sure there are plenty of examples you can think of. If you try it, I'd love to hear how it goes!
