



Notes from the MP Library Media Center

Greetings and welcome to the 2017 – 2018 school year at the Meridian Park Library! With over 750 students this year, we are going to be busy reading, checking out many fabulous books, and learning how to access and use information in the 21st century! As a matter of fact, 31 classes will visit the library every week! With so many classes, we have two librarians this year. I am so excited to welcome Maggie Cramer as the kindergarten librarian this year. Mrs. Cramer comes to Shoreline from the Edmonds School District, and has a great deal of experience designing and implementing curriculum for all elementary-age students, as well as a love of reading and children's literature. Mr. Mike (Mike Adams) returns as our library technician extraordinaire. I am entering my fourteenth year in the library, and my thirty-second year in education overall.

NITTY GRITTY INFORMATION:

In addition to visiting the library with their classes, students may visit on their own as their class schedules allow during the week. There is **no student supervision in the library before school** begins in the morning. Therefore, students may come to the library at 9:00 in the morning to return books or check out new ones before heading off to the classes.

After school, students may stop by the library to return or renew library books or check out new books. However, there is *no student supervision in the library after school*, so children are not allowed to stay in the library while they wait for parents to pick them up.

Parents are welcome to **stay with their children in the library** before and after school. Parents can also check out books from the MP library. Please stop by at any time to set up accounts for yourselves.

As I do every year, I will run the Sasquatch and Young Readers Choice (YRC) chapter book award programs for fourth, fifth, and sixth graders, and the Washington Children's Choice Picture Book (WCCPB) award program for kindergarten, first, second, and third graders. Stay tuned for more information about these programs in upcoming newsletters, as well as on the library website.



We will have a *One-Day-Wonder*Scholastic Fall Book Fair on
Tuesday, December 5th. This
year's theme is "Wild West Book
Fair." The Book Fair will run during
the school day as well as the evening
along with PTSA's monthly meeting.
Students will have a chance to
preview the Book Fair on Friday,
December 1st. It will be a fun event

for everyone. The previous two years' one-day book fairs were huge successes as well as a lot of fun. Book fair profits benefit all MP students through the purchase of new books and the support of author visits and other literacy events.

Parent Service/Volunteer Opportunities at Meridian Park

ROOM PARENT



PTSA is rolling out this new program for the 2017-18 school year. The ideal candidate is someone who is already planning to volunteer in the classroom weekly. Your job as room parent is to act as a conduit of information back and forth between the PTSA and the students, parents, and teacher. Our goal is to make sure parents are better informed about what is going on at the school and in their classrooms. PTSA will provide

KINDERGARTEN LUNCH HELPER (Daily, 11:20 am - 11:45 am)

Kindergarteners need lots of help at lunch. It is not uncommon to see kindergarteners struggle with opening milk cartons, string cheese, yogurt tubes, and even reusable containers brought from home. Finding their ID, getting through the hot lunch line, and carrying their food tray can also be very difficult. Your job duties will include: circulating the cafeteria and to assist with opening items, reminding kids to eat, working with staff to address bathroom needs, and just generally making sure lunch is successful. We hope that within a few weeks the kindergarteners will be in the swing of things and won't need as much help. Help out just once a week or every day. Your time and efforts are very much appreciated. How do you help? Come in to the school

around 11:15 and sign in at the office. You can then walk right down to the cafeteria and check in with the lunchroom monitors. Tell them you are there to help with lunch. You will walk around and visit, remind kids to eat their lunch, and be ready to open a lot of milks!

GREEN TEAM PARENT LEADERS (Daily, 11:30 am - 1:15 pm)

Help train the student Green Team to be confident school leaders. Their job is to remind their classmates how to dispose of their lunch properly. At Meridian Park, we recycle and compost in the school lunchroom. All plastic forks, spoons, straws, and wrappers go into the trash. We also are required to throw away yogurt containers and other plastic containers like Lunchables. We do RECYCLE the milk cartons, juice boxes, any cans, and water bottles. We COMPOST all leftover foods and paper products. It is HARD to get the littlest of our students through the garbage line at school. The Green Team needs assistance regarding how to do this job themselves and to receive words of encouragement as they help their classmates. It is a rewarding opportunity to make a positive impact at our school and have a really fun time too! Preference for sign-up is to choose one day of the week and attend all lunches on that week day for the month of September. After September, Green Team parents will attend lunch the first full week of each month: October 2-6, November 6-10, December 4-8, January 8-12, February 5-9, March 5-9, April 2-6, May 7-11, June 4-8. ART DOCENT VOLUNTEERS


