## School District Levies - Please Vote on February 13

At their November 6, 2017 meeting, the Shoreline School District Board of Directors approved two resolutions to place <u>two four-year replacement levies</u> on the <u>February 13, 2018 special election ballot</u>. These levies would replace existing levies that will expire at the end of 2018.

#### **PROPOSITION 1:**

## **Replacement of Expiring Levy for Educational Programs and Operations**

This replacement levy helps fund education programs not fully supported by state and federal funding including (but not limited to): **special education** programs, **highly capable** programs, and **remedial** programs - as well as **extra-curricular** student activities such as **music**, **drama** and **athletics**.

The maximum tax rate for Proposition 1 would be \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed property value annually. This rate would collect:

- \$21,300,000 in 2019
- \$23,500,000 in 2020
- \$25,602,000 in 2021
- \$28,250,000 in 2022

**This accounts for roughly 20 percent** of Shoreline School District's operating budget.

#### **PROPOSITION 2:**

Replacement of Expiring Capital Levy for Technology Improvement and Support

This replacement levy funds instructional technology and internet access for students and staff across the district. These funds help pay for (but are not limited to): student and staff **computers and technology access**, as well as **staffing**, **professional development** and **training**.

The estimated tax rates for Proposition 2 would be as follows:

- \$0.23 per \$1,000 of assessed property value in 2019
- **\$0.21 per \$1,000** of assessed property value in 2020
- \$0.19 per \$1,000 of assessed property value in 2021
- \$0.17 per \$1,000 of assessed property value in 2022

These rates would collect \$3,250,000 annually.

Ballots will be mailed to registered voters in Shoreline School District on January 24, 2018 and must be returned or postmarked by February 13, 2018. To register to vote, visit <a href="https://www.kingcounty.gov/elections">www.kingcounty.gov/elections</a>. The deadline to register is January 15 in order to vote on the February ballot.







### From the Health Office

#### **TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?**

Your student wakes up looking flushed, feeling congested or queasy. Do you send your student to school? To make this decision a little easier keep two C's in mind: **Contagious** and **Comfort**.

Please **keep your student home with following symptoms**, which may mean that the illness is contagious:

- Fever above 100 degrees (must be fever free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication before returning to school)
- Vomiting or diarrhea (must be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to school)
- Sore throat, especially if combined with fever or swollen neck glands
- Heavy nasal congestion or frequent, incessant cough
- Inability to contain secretions (unable to reliably cough or sneeze into elbow)
- Your student has been diagnosed with a contagious virus or infection
- Thick greenish-yellow drainage from the eyes
- Unusual fatigue, paleness, lack of appetite or irritability

Without any of these symptoms, the question becomes whether your student feels well enough to function comfortably at school. Please feel to call the Health Office at **206-393-4124** if you have questions.

need to find work. Students learn technology skills, receive one-on-one advising, and participate in mock interviews conducted by local employers. Every quarter, many of our students are able to find jobs. Employers know about us, and often make us aware of job openings. Registration is open now. The first orientation session is January 9. Classes will be conducted at the Hopelink Center in Shoreline.
