Play Every Day Recess Program

Mondays and Wednesdays, February 26 - June 20
11:00 am - 1:00 pm

Play Every Day is a grant-funded program that places a YMCA staff member at each Shoreline elementary school as a twice per week large group recess coach. The Recess Coach organizes activities and games for children during their lunch recess period. Music is also played during each session, and the children have an area where they can dance and sing along. The Recess Coach works closely with school staff.

Two elementary schools in Shoreline piloted the program last year and found positive benefits for students, and this year, the program is being expanded to include every elementary school. By engaging in positive, cooperative activities at recess, students directly learn social and interpersonal skills, which carry over into the classroom. Brain research also shows direct ties between physical activity, increased oxygen to the brain, and an enhanced ability to learn new concepts afterwards. By having positive engagement at recess, the program also decreases student conflicts that need to be resolved during class time, thereby increasing teaching and learning time in the classroom. Having a recess coach on the playground encourages students who are lonely to be a part of some organized fun. Play Every Day in Shoreline is funded generously by the Dale Turner YMCA and the Shoreline Public Schools Foundation, in partnership with the Shoreline School District.

From the Health Office

TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?

Your student wakes up looking flushed, feeling congested or queasy. Do you send your student to school? To make this decision a little easier keep two C's in mind:

Contagious and **Comfort**.

Please **keep your student home with following symptoms**, which may mean that the illness is contagious:

- Fever above 100 degrees (must be fever free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication before returning to school)
- Vomiting or diarrhea (must be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to school)
- Sore throat, especially if combined with fever or swollen neck glands
- Heavy nasal congestion or frequent, incessant cough
- Inability to contain secretions (unable to reliably cough or sneeze into elbow)
- Your student has been diagnosed with a contagious virus or infection
- Thick greenish-yellow drainage from the eyes
- Unusual fatigue, paleness, lack of appetite or irritability

Without any of these symptoms, the question becomes whether your student feels well enough to function comfortably at school. Please feel to call the Health Office at **206-393-4124** if you have questions
