



END-OF-THE-YEAR LIBRARY BOOK ROUND UP (It will be here before we know it!!)

The school year will wind down quickly. In order to complete an inventory of all library books, we will need them returned before the last week of school. *Below is a schedule to help students return their books.*

By Thursday, May 23

Second through sixth grade students can have no more than two library books checked out. First graders can have one book checked out.

By Thursday, May 30

First through sixth grade students can have no more than one library book checked out.

The last day to check out library books is *Friday, May 31*.

ALL LIBRARY BOOKS ARE DUE BY FRIDAY, JUNE 7.

Students who still have books on their library records after June 7th will take home letters to share with parents, letting them know about the overdue books. If a book cannot be found, a student can either purchase a replacement copy with the same binding and cover, or pay for the book (\$10 for a paperback and \$20 for a hard cover).

Students will not receive their report cards on the last day of school, June 20th, if they have not taken care of their overdue and lost books. Report cards will be held in the front office until students find, replace, or pay for books.

Please help your children look for library books at home, as well as in vehicles, and other places that they visit.

Counselor's Corner

As we go into our last month for our Character Traits, **POSITIVITY** seemed to fit well. We will be encouraging and recognizing kids



throughout May to think and speak about what is happening in their lives in optimistic and enthusiastic ways. With our continuous teaching of Growth Mindset, this is a great opportunity to turn statements like "I can't do this" into "This is hard, but I can try!" We will celebrate our Positive Cheetahs at our last VIC lunch for the year at the end of the month. While we don't have an official Character Trait for June (as it previously was just two weeks of school), in the past we've had INDEPENDENCE, which is very fitting as we prepare kids to move up to the next grade level. You can find helpful booklists for both traits here.

While the year is wrapping up, there is still lots to do! One big upcoming task for 3rd-6th graders is SBA testing. Sometimes testing can bring stress and anxiety along with it, so we try to be proactive in teaching students about ways to manage these feelings.
