Parents of 5th Grade Students

Reminder: Your student must have a <u>tetanus/pertussis booster</u> (<u>Tdap</u>) before returning to school next fall as a 6th grader.

If your student has not yet received this vaccine, we would recommend you make an appointment ASAP, since appointments

may be harder to get right before the beginning of the school year. Please note that your student must be at least <u>11 years old</u> to receive the Tdap booster. If your student turns 11 during the 2019-20 school year, please schedule an appointment as soon as possible after his/her birthday.

Your doctor may recommend additional immunizations, but Tdap is the only one required for school attendance at this time. Students out of compliance at the beginning of next year will be excluded from school until they receive the vaccine.

Once he/she has received the vaccine, please inform us by one of the following methods:

- Ask your healthcare provider to fax the documentation to 206-393-4259
- Between now and June 20th OR after August 26th: Leave a message on the nurse's voicemail (206-393-4124) with your student's name, vaccine received, and date the vaccine was given

Please call with any questions or if you need assistance finding a clinic.


