



Mandarin Club is excited for another school year to begin!

We look forward to seeing all former students return to continue with the learning of this fascinating language – and, of course, we welcome new students to join us!

What is new this year for Mandarin?

First, we will keep morning Mandarin classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays at the same start time. We hope to schedule Monday and Wednesday afternoon classes this year as well. Because of the Wednesday early release, we will start class earlier that day

and add more enrichment activities. The detailed class flyers will arrive home soon after school begins.

Introduction: Mandarin teacher Hua Zhang currently teaches Mandarin 4 at Shorewood High School. Hua is a natural story teller and a native Chinese Mandarin speaker, and formerly an award-winning public speaker, journalist, and editor in China. When Hua arrived in the United States in 1996, she re-invented herself as a designer and a dancer who performed traditional Chinese folk dance in various international culture events. Her dance pictures were featured in local print media numerous times. Hua started her first Mandarin program at Meridian Park Elementary during the 2005-2006 school year. Her Mandarin services have benefited many MP students, families and the community during the past 14 years. From 2007 to 2018, Hua has been recognized many times for her excellent and dedicated work in periodicals including: Enterprise Newspaper, Shoreline Area News, Seattle Times and World Journal, the largest Chinese newspaper in the North America.

Hua teaches more than just the Chinese language. In her lessons, she often incorporates Chinese history, customs and traditions so that her students can experience the Chinese culture in various ways. She has developed her own teaching materials and curricula for students who are at different levels of learning the language. Hua believes in establishing a solid foundation for the long-term learning of Mandarin by engaging her students through different forms of enrichment and by maximizing their interest.

From the Health Office

Welcome to the new school year! Please keep me informed of any health concerns or changes in your child's health including new health issues, medication changes, and immunization updates.

Medications: Whenever possible, medication should be scheduled during non-school hours. However, in the event your child needs medication during school hours, please be sure to have the "Permission to Administer Medication" form completed by your child's physician and returned to the school nurse.

Hearing/Vision Screening: Washington State law requires schools to conduct auditory and visual screenings for elementary students in grades K, I, 2, 3, and 5. The Meridian Park nurse will be doing hearing and vision screenings in October 2019 (dates to be determined). Parents/guardians will be notified of abnormal results.

Immunization Compliance: Washington State law requires that all children up to the age of 21 be fully immunized on or before the first day of school. Students can attend school under a temporary status, but they must have proof of immunization or an approved Certificate of Exemption by the 30th calendar day after the first day of attendance. If there is no proof/waiver by the 30th day after the first day of attendance at school, the student may not continue to attend school until documents are received. For students who start on September 4th 2019, this means October 4th is the last day they can attend without being in compliance.

From the Library



Greetings from the Meridian Park Library Media Center!

Welcome to the 2019 – 2020 school year in the Meridian Park Library! We are going to busy reading and checking out many fabulous books, as well as learning to access and use information, coding robots, and having Maker Space experiences in the library! Students visit the library with their classes once per week, and may visit on their own as their class schedules allow throughout the week. There is no student supervision in the library before school begins in the morning. Therefore, students are not allowed in the library until 9:00 to return and check out books. Students may also stop by the library to return, renew, and check out new books after school. Parents can also check out books from the MP library. Parents can stop by the library at any time to set up MP library accounts for themselves.

Book Award Programs

We will run four Washington Library Association book award programs this year.

First, there is the Washington Children's Choice Picture Book (WCCPB) award program for kindergarten, first, second, and third graders. Students read 20 picture books both in the classroom and during library visits. At the end of the reading cycle, each student votes for his or her favorite book, helping to choose both the Meridian Park and Washington State winners.

Second, for the first time at Meridian Park, we will participate in the OTTER Chapter Book award program. OTTER stands for *Our Time To Enjoy Reading*. Students can check out the chapter books, and/or listen to them, then vote for their favorites later in the year.

Third, also for the first time at Meridian Park, we will participate in the Towner Nonfiction Award program. There are 10 nominees. Students will either listen to books during library lessons and/or check them out on their own, then vote for their favorites later in the year.

Positive Behavior: At Meridian Park, we work hard to create a positive and welcoming school climate. In part, this is done through our Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) program. All year, students learn about our school wide behavior expectations (Be Respectful, Be Responsible, and Be Safe) and how to earn Cheetah Cheers by doing the

right thing and following the expectations in all of our common areas. More information can be found here.

Character Trait of the Month: This month we are working on RESPECT! This is one of our three main school behavior expectations, which is part of our overall PBIS program. We have a lot

of fun positive interventions, like our VIC lunch, to catch kids doing the right thing. Our monthly Character Trait intervention provides a specific time where teachers can teach really important vocabulary and our student's model the traits all month (and hopefully all year and life!). At the end of each month we celebrate students who have been role models in this area with our VIC (Very Important Cheetah) Lunch in the cafeteria. Please see the booklist for great ideas on how to continue the learning at home with trait specific books.

Roots of Empathy

Her focus has always been educating others – parents, educators, administrators and legislators – about the unique learning needs of children who learn at markedly faster and more complex rates than their chronological peers. Having been an unserved gifted child herself, she remembers the sense of frustration, isolation and "marching in place" of her K-12 experience.
