Positive Behavior Supports Intervention (PBIS):

Our Kindergarten team works closely with our I-6th colleagues and classrooms to share in our work around Positive Behavior Supports Intervention (PBIS) at Meridian Park. We believe, if we are consistent in teaching common social emotional skills and use common language, it will have a positive impact on students developing meaningful relationships, creating a sense of belonging, and increasing engagement in learning. Below is an overview of several PBIS systems our kindergarten community utilizes.

PBIS celebrations:

- Cheetah Cheers (individual) & Cheetah Paws (class)
- School wide behavior expectations learning (hallway, bathroom, cafeteria, bus zones, classrooms, arrival/dismissal)
- Classroom meetings to build community and connection
- Our Guidance Team meets weekly to support student needs and growth
- Second Step Social Emotional Learning (SEL) lessons
- Bully Prevention Assembly by Taproot Theater (coming up on Dec. 6)
- Reset Stations every classroom (including library, P.E., and music) has a reset station available for students
- We use the Zones of Regulation curriculum throughout our program to help students learn to identify, talk about, and self-manage their emotions If you have any questions about our PBIS efforts please don't hesitate to contact our School Counselor, Chelsey Hays at 206-393-1797.
