- Weekly meal boxes contain 5 breakfasts, 5 lunches and milk. Orders can be placed online between Monday and Wednesday, and scheduled for pick up the following Wednesday.
- Free and Reduced meal applications are available online. Even though meals are currently free, please apply if you think you may qualify as other resources and benefits may be available to you.
- Weather and Meal Box Distribution: If any weather condition forces a delay or cancelation, we will communicate using the robo-email and phone call system. Be sure to check your messages.
- Veterans Day: Due to the holiday, meal boxes will NOT be distributed on Wednesday, November 11th. Meal boxes will be distributed on THURSDAY, November 12th.

## From the Health Office

Flu season is almost here and the fact is that the flu can be scary; especially for the ones we love most. Everyone aged 6 months and older needs a flu vaccine to stay healthier this fall.

Here is why:

- The flu is dangerous. The flu is different from the everyday cold. It can last 2 weeks or more and cause serious complications such as pneumonia. Every year the flu causes millions of illnesses, hundreds of thousands of hospitalizations, and tens of thousands of deaths in the United States.
- Getting your flu vaccine is the best way to prevent the flu. Flu vaccines reduce your chances of getting sick with the flu. Although good health behaviors including proper etiquette for coughs and sneezes can help reduce the spread of flu, experts agree a flu vaccine is the best way to prevent flu.

• It saves lives and protects those on the

frontlines. Getting your flu vaccine could save someone else from getting seriously ill. Babies and young children, pregnant women, people 65 and older, and those with certain medical conditions—are all at increased risk of complications from flu. Getting vaccinated reduces the spread of flu from you to them, which can protect your family members, co- workers, and all those around you. This year, your flu vaccine will not only keep you and your loved ones healthier and out of the medical setting, it will preserve precious resources for those on the COVID- 19 frontlines.

Both flu and COVID-19 may be spreading this fall, so it's more important than ever to get an annual flu vaccine. The best time to get vaccinated is before flu viruses start to spread—typically by the end of October. So, don't wait. Find a flu vaccine location near you.

Hello MP Families!

Cheetah Curbside Check Out is up and running. Below is a schedule through December.

Be on the lookout for announcements and links to the check-out form through Messenger (MP Office) and Seesaw announcements.

It has been so much fun to receive students' book requests and fill their orders.

Reminder ~ Students will check out books in grade level bands. See the schedule below for your children's check out dates.

- All students, K-5, are allowed to have up to six books checked out on their accounts.
- Library Staff will fill your library book requests and honor specific title requests to the best of our ability.
- The Pick-Up day is always Wednesdays. Pick up dates coordinate with curriculum pick up dates.
- You may keep the library books for two weeks.
- You can **return your library books** only on the following days and at the following times: **Thursdays**, **9:00 4:00**, **and Fridays**, **9:00 4:00**.
- We will quarantine returned books for a minimum of 72 hours per the Governor's Phase 2 requirements for libraries, as well as recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Public Health Seattle & King County, and the REALM project.

#### **Character Trait of the Month**

The trait for November is **GRATITUDE**. Gratitude can look like appreciating what you have, what you are given and what others do for you. In action, gratitude looks like letting someone know that you appreciate their work or help, and thinking of a way to help someone in return. Research shows that being grateful and showing thanks to those that are helpful to us can boost endorphins and make us feel good. Plus, it makes the other person feel good too - win-win! A great book to explore this idea more is How Full is Your Bucket, for Kids, by Tom Wrath and Mary Beckmeyer.

At the end of the month we celebrate students who have been role models in this area with our VIC (Very Important Cheetah) Lunch. During remote learning, students will receive their VIC certificate in the mail and celebrated on our Friday morning announcement. ### Shoreline Special Needs PTSA

The Shoreline Special Needs PTSA is a district wide PTSA that focuses on supporting and connecting families of students with special needs, as well as partnering with teachers and the school district.

We are an additional resource available to any family in the Shoreline School District who has a child on a 504 plan or an IEP, and for families who have a child who has not yet been identified as requiring school support but would like to connect with other families of special needs kids in the district.

We typically meet every other month throughout the school year and often have keynote speakers discussing topics relevant to our members at our meetings.

During the spring and summer our PTA has offered virtual parent support meetings (via Zoom). They have been an informal way for our parents and caregivers to connect with each other and also a great place to learn about what families are experiencing and sharing that with the district- we are continuing to offer these meetings through November and beyond based on interest.

In addition to receiving regular communication from us in the form of a monthly newsletter and membership packets with info pertinent to each membership meeting, we also offer members the ability to join a closed Facebook group for members only which is a wonderful support network of SSNPTSA families- sorry no district employee of any kind is able to join this group for privacy reasons.

Free webinar coordinated by Governing for Racial Equity and Inclusion network. In the first hour, a panel will provide an overview of how they used Racial Equity Tools (RET) to plan and implement equitable and anti-racist initiatives. In the second hour, participants will have break-out sessions for deeper discussions on using RETs to engage the community, remove barriers to participation, and transform organizations.

### Washington COVID-19 Immigrant Relief Fund

The Washington COVID-19 Immigrant Relief Fund provides a \$1,000 one-time direct payment (up to \$3,000 per household). Eligibility includes: WA resident; at least 18 years old; been significantly affected by the pandemic (such as losing work, being infected by the virus, or caring for a family member who was infected); ineligible to receive federal stimulus dollars or unemployment insurance money due to immigration status.
